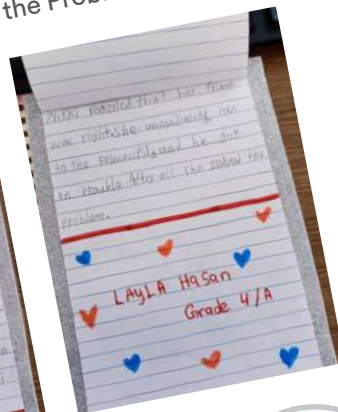
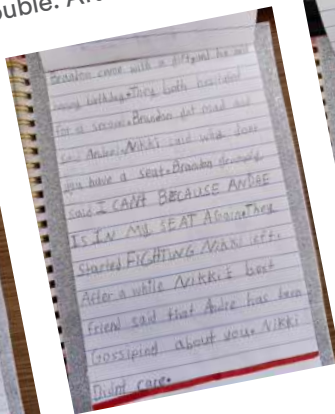
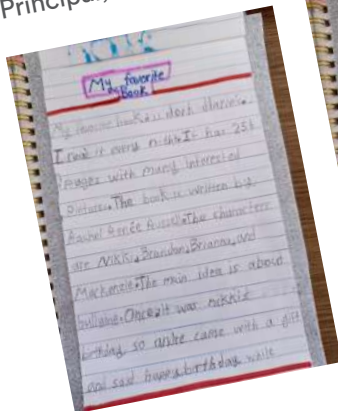

These digital art pieces show things that can help young minds in different school environments, whether in mental health, or imagination and creativity. Digital art can inspire others to make, create, and innovate.

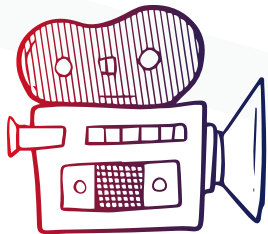
